

**CITY OF GRACE, IDAHO
MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
HELD AT GRACE CITY HALL
DECEMBER 21, 2016**

Mayor Barthlome called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Councilmember Sotutu gave the invocation.

Clerk Reeves led the Pledge of Allegiance.

The minutes of the regular meeting held on December 7, 2016 were discussed. Motion to approve the minutes of 12/7/2016 was made by Councilmember Lloyd. Councilmember Ridenour seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Bills in the amount of \$18,927.75 and payroll in the amounts of \$9147.28 were reviewed for payment. Councilmember Ridenour moved that the bills and payroll be approved as reviewed. Councilmember Sotutu seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Mayor Barthlome turned the time to Fire Chief Curtis Peck to report on the Fire Department. He thanked Monsanto for the gloves that they had donated. He reported that the firemen and their families would be caroling on December 22, 2016.

Superintendent Bredehoft discussed Jacob Rasmussen's setting permit. In light of Mr. Rasmussen's passing away he felt that the permit fee should be refunded to Mr. Rasmussen's parents, Kenneth and Melonie Rasmussen. Superintendent Bredehoft said that he would make sure that they weren't planning on still building the home before refunding the permit fee. Councilmember Lloyd moved to refund the permit fee as long as the Rasmussen's weren't going to build a home. Councilmember Ridenour seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

City alcohol licenses were presented for 2017 as follows:

- **Sam's Market for beer only- \$12.50**
- **EZ-Way for beer only- \$12.50**
- **Grace Lounge for beer and liquor- \$262.50**

Councilmember Peck moved to approve the licenses. Councilmember Lloyd seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously with Councilmember Ridenour abstaining from voting.

The merry-go-all for the park was discussed. Superintendent Bredehoft got a price of \$4,434.94 including shipping from the new company that Councilmember Sotutu suggested at the previous

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meeting. This price is significantly less than the other price quoted to the city. Councilmember Sotutu moved to approve the purchase of the merry-go-all for the park. Councilmember Lloyd seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Superintendent Bredehoft reported that the heater at well-house #3 had been replaced. He spoke with Intermountain Gas about running a gas-line to that well-house and that they were willing to run it at no cost to the city in the spring when the ground is thawed. He also reported that he had ordered the parts for the generator for the lift station. He also ordered 2 detour signs for \$130.00 a piece because that was a very good price. He reported that he had met with J-U-B engineers concerning the waste water facility plan grant. He learned that the city had about 200 points which gives the city a good chance at receiving the grant to upgrade the waste water facility plan. He requested to purchase a concrete saw from Centennial Lube for \$1999.95 with a spare blade for \$499.00. Councilmember Lloyd moved to allow the purchase of a concrete saw. Councilmember Ridenour seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Mayor Barthlome reported that the Waste Water Treatment Plant inspection done by the Department of Environmental Quality was passed with flying colors. She thanked Tina Bredehoft as well as the other city maintenance workers for their hard work.

Meeting adjourned at 6:25 p.m.
